## Summer Time Fun

Pets of all kinds have gathered in the Kids' Place to celebrate *Paws, Claws, Scales and Tales*, the library's 2006 Summer Reading Program. Kids of all ages, numbering over 500 in the first week, have also gathered in the library to register for the reading aspect of the program. Participating kids earn tokens by reading; the more they read, the more tokens they can earn. The tokens are then redeemed in the Kids' Place Store, pictured above with two young patrons, for a variety of prizes. This year's registration continues until July 19 in the Kids' Place.



You don't have to register to attend any of the age-appropriate activities of Summer Reading. These include special presenters and pets in the Library Park, story hours and craft days. Stop into the library to pick up a schedule of remaining events. The Summer Reading Program will conclude on July 27 with a special party in the Library Park.

## Music in the Air

The Great Falls Public Library's sixth annual **Music in the Library Park** series begins on June 29 and continues through August 31 at 7:00 p.m. in the Library Park. If the weather is inclement, these free programs will shift inside to the Cordingley Room.

This year you can hear the rousing Celtic melodies of the nationally known duo **Willson and McKee**, who play a variety of instruments ranging from Hammer Dulcimer to the Irish Bouzouki, or you can hear the sweet strains of classical guitar and flute with **Meredith Connie & Amy Eyles**.



Johnny Cash fans will want to catch **Cold Hard Cash**, a tribute band headed by Merle Peterson who sounds and looks like the second coming of Johnny. A longtime musician, Peterson has played solo and with various bands in Missoula and Seattle. "I wanted to do more than just stand on a stage and play music," Peterson states. "We developed this act to take the audience on a musical journey."

Fans of acoustic music won't be disappointed. Four folk/rock artists will appear. **Bob Leader** from East Glacier will stop by on a statewide tour; local songbird **Jeni Dodd** returns by popular demand; **Viveca Arnst** will play contemporary and

classical music; and longtime Great Falls folk/rock musician **Rick Tryon's** show will be highlighted by selections from his recently released CD *Hometown Brew*.

If blues is your bag, catch **Hit-n-Run** formed in November of 2005. Boasting a full horn section, **Hit-n-Run** employs an eclectic funk/rock/blues style of both contemporary and classics with horns, hits, and steel riffs.



For a complete change of pace, come hear the **Great Falls Trombone Trio** with Ted Dollarhide, Sara Seekins, and Bob Bailey.

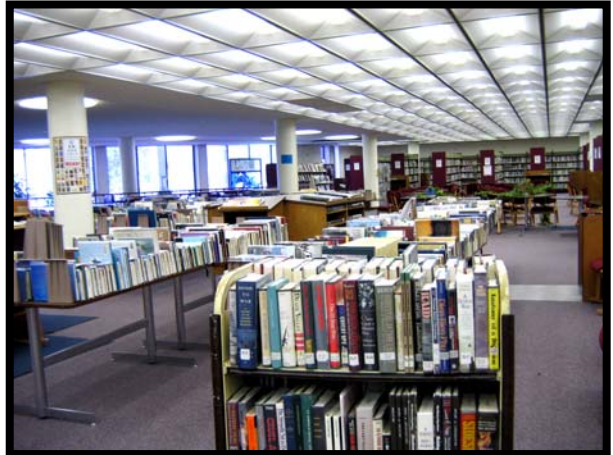

## *Interlibrary Loan Changes*

Beginning July 1, library patrons may receive up to six interlibrary loans within a calendar year (prorated to three for 2006) at no charge. After the sixth loan within a calendar year, a fee of \$2.00 will be charged for each additional request.

While the number of interlibrary loans has been steadily increasing, reimbursements from the state will have decreased to zero in fiscal year 2006/2007.

Facing ongoing budget difficulties the library can no longer afford to provide interlibrary loan as a completely free and unrestricted service. The new policy is an attempt to continue a useful and popular service in a fiscally responsible manner. For more information call 453-0349.
